

Two of our senior students represented Te Totara at the Civic ANZAC service at the Cenotaph in Memorial Park on Thursday 25th April. Hunter and Jason, who are two of our Year 6 Pastoral Care Leaders, placed a wreath at the cenotaph on behalf of Te Totara Primary School. Thank you to Mrs Lingard (in charge of Pastoral Care Leaders) and the families that supported these students in proudly representing the school. ANZAC Day, 2024

On Thursday, 25th of April, we went to the ANZAC ceremony at the Memorial Park in Hamilton at 10am.

The ceremony began with the soldiers marching into position. There were speeches and then very important people e.g. hospital staff and representatives of different organisations laid wreaths all around a war memorial obelisk (a tall stone column with four sloping sides and a pointed top, made in honour of an important person or event).

There was a minute of silence to remember all those who have and do serve in wars, those who have died, those injured, and all their families.



School groups were asked to lay their wreaths. So we placed our Te Totara wreath against the memorial, saluted the wreath and then turned to salute the oldest veteran. To finish off the ceremony a bugle played 'The Last Post'.

We were very proud of ourselves and felt very emotional. We were very happy to represent Te Totara School.

WINTER SCHOOL UNIFORM FOR TERMS 2 & 3

At this time of the year we are noticing an increasing need for warmer clothing. Although not compulsory we advise wearing **black thermal under garments** i.e. singlet, long sleeve polypropylene. Also, our winter uniform requirements are <u>plain black socks or tights and plain black shoes</u>.

A number of students are appearing with different coloured jackets/sweatshirts. Children are asked to wear the red Te Totara polar fleece jacket/sweater only. We understand families may still be sorting their children's winter uniforms so we would appreciate it if your children could please be in the correct full winter school uniform within the next two weeks.

NAMING OF SCHOOL UNIFORM

Please, please, please can you make sure all items of school uniform are <u>clearly named</u>. Please do not assume that your child will know that something belongs to them "because it has a black dot on the tag". If an item of clothing is found it cannot be returned unless it is named. We go out of our way to identify and return lost property, but are unable to do this when clothing is not named.

We ask ALL families to please check your child's uniform on a weekly basis to ensure they are wearing their own uniform rather than someone else's.
