Te Totara Primary school is a member of a large Community of Learning (C.o.L.) which is mainly based in the North Eastern area of Hamilton. It takes in all the schools of the Fairfield Cluster stretching right up to our school in the Rototuna area (19 schools in all). Collaborative work began between these schools in Term 2 last year with the main objective being to enhance learning opportunities, achievement and wellbeing for all learners across the C.o.L.

One of the important initiatives underway has been named "Rongohia te Hau" which is a way of gathering information across the Community of Learning about how families and whanau feel about your children's experiences and your own experiences in our learning areas. It also gathers information about our acknowledgement of your cultural groups.

The survey takes about 10 minutes to complete with a few simple statements that you need to choose a response to. I have listed one example below:

'Teachers in this school know me and my child/children and I know who they are.'

The responses to choose from are:

Never, Hardly ever, Sometimes, Mostly Always

Your participation in this survey is voluntary and your responses are anonymous. The responses will be collated by the University of Waikato as part of their work with the wider Community of Learning. It is used to provide evidence to inform decision making about next steps with regard to professional development in our school. We are also doing teacher surveys, student surveys Year 4-6 and classroom observations so that we are able to build a full picture of our current situation.

Just a little reminder that if you have changed any of your details i.e. phone, address, email or your family circumstances have changed.... please advise the School Office so we can update your records accordingly.

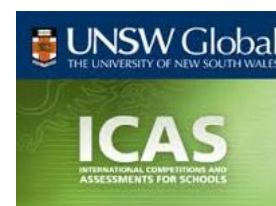

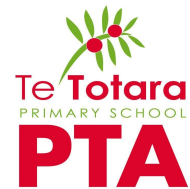
