It has been an eventful couple of days with the announcement of a cluster of community transmission of Covid 19 in Auckland. With that development and the directive that we will be moving into Alert Level 2, I sent out messages through our School App and Facebook page to ask you to read comprehensive communication on our website. If you haven't seen that message yet, I urge you to look at it.

Thank you so much for responding in such a positive way to the guidelines that have been swiftly re-established at Te Totara to the emergence again of Covid 19 in New Zealand.

While we all feel disappointed and had hoped this would not occur, as it is such a 'tricky virus' which is so prevalent around the world, then there was a high chance this could happen.

The main positive is that in our country, and most importantly Te Totara Primary School, we are well equipped to respond to what we need to do to keep our community safe and functioning well.

As our Prime Minister said at her briefing today "we have dealt with the news of this outbreak in an urgent but calm and methodical way." This is also what we have moved to do at school, with an urgent but calm and methodical response to what we need to do to protect our own community. You can be reassured that as things develop and if changes to Alert Levels do occur then we have the capacity to continue to respond in this manner. I will continue to communicate with you as soon as I have any updates or important information to share with you. This will be through our School App, Facebook page and Website areas.

For all of us this is an anxious time but I know we will get through this by following the protocols that have been set, and everyone doing their bit to track back towards elimination of Covid 19 again.

Children adjust their behaviour and thinking from the reactions of the adults around them.

I put this piece in my message yesterday to you, I think it is worth repeating here:

A good thought to share with your children when talking about the virus is that 'we are all a bit disappointed that this virus is in New Zealand again, however we are being told by our Prime Minister and Dr Ashley Bloomfield to do some things to help us all stay safe and well. We can do this by following the Alert Level 2 rules, and our Te Totara STARS behaviours. We did this so well last time and the virus went away; we can do it again this time!'

You and your families are always in my thoughts, kia kaha whanau, together we will get through this.

It is useful from time to time to remind our supporters and families of the guidelines we have established, in relation to what we expect of our families who are on the sidelines. We have a Code of Behaviour that originated in conjunction with Sport Waikato which outlines those expectations.

For your information, it is printed for you below:

TE TOTARA CODE OF BEHAVIOUR FOR PARENTS AND SUPPORTERS



- Encourage children to take part in sport but do not force them.
- Focus on the children's effort and performance rather than whether they won or lost.
- Teach children that trying hard is more important than winning.
- Encourage fair and skilful players.
- Insist that they always compete according to the rules and respect officials and coaches' decisions.
- Never ridicule or shout at a child. Mistakes are part of learning and everyone loses sometime.
- Children learn from example so applaud all good performances and good sportsmanship including the opponents
- If you disagree with an official do not question the official in public. There is a standard procedure for complaints - see the manager or the meeting referee.
- Recognise the importance of volunteer officials, administrators and coaches who give their time so that your child can be involved.
- Remember children compete in sport for their enjoyment, not ours.
- Talk to your child. Do they enjoy their sport? Are they learning that doing their best, being sporting and having fun are important?
- Teach children to respect the effort of their opponents.
- Encourage children to think about the stars. Are they being respectful, self-managing, trying their best, always learning and making smart decisions.

Thank you for adhering to these guidelines.

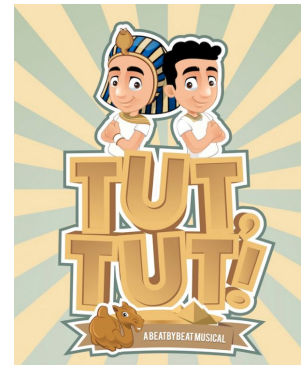



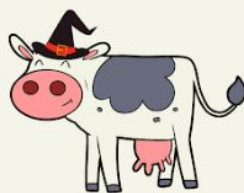
