
and communities where all people feel safe, valued and respected.

ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

NZ GOVERNMENT & MINISTRY OF EDUCATION EXPECTATION



As you may be aware, the Government and Ministry of Education are heavily promoting the importance of student's <u>regular attendance (90%+)</u> at school and all schools have been asked to be proactive in this area.

We emailed Attendance Letters to families last week whose child/en have less than 90% attendance. The purpose of the letter was to raise parents/caregivers awareness around the loss of learning for their child when they are absent from school. Days away from school can quickly add up over the course of a school year.

What does regular attendance at school mean?

Being at school everyday matters. The more knowledge ākonga (learners) get at school, the more choices they will have when they leave.

Those missing school more frequently are likely to have bigger gaps in their learning which is why it is important to know how often individual students miss school. To do this, schools are required to provide attendance data to the Ministry of Education which is analysed each week. Each student is allocated to one of four attendance categories:

- Regular attendance: students with over 90% attendance
- Irregular absence: students with more than 80% and up to 90% attendance
- Moderate absence: students with more than 70% and up to 80% attendance
- Chronic absence: students 70% attendance or less



Does my child have to go to school every day?

- Yes. Up to the age of 16 years, legally your child must go to school every day they are well. It goes without saying that we would not expect families to send their child to school if they are unwell they need to be at home until they are better.
- Under the Ministry of Education attendance codes, a family holiday during term time is classified as an <u>unjustified absence</u> even if a written explanation was provided and acknowledged.
 We encourage families to plan family holidays during the school holiday breaks, rather than during term time as this has less of an impact on your child's learning.
- The more time your child is away from school, the harder it is to catch up on missed learning, which is why we focus on reducing challenges that might prevent students from attending.
- Missing one week of school each term means missing a whole year of learning by the time your child turns 16 years old.

Parents and Caregiver Tips

Ākonga/students are legally required to attend school every day. Support is available for families of children who are struggling to attend.

- Parents play a big role in helping their child do well in school. You can do this by making sure
 your child goes to school every day. Let the school know if your child is unwell and will not be
 attending school. Our preferred method of contact is an absentee message via our School
 App.
- Setting clear expectations with your child about why attending school every day is important.
- Schools and parents/caregivers should work in partnership to support tamariki regularly attend school. If your child/ren are reluctant to go to school and you're having trouble, talk to us as we are more than happy to help.
- Prepare your child the night before school help them pack their bag.
- Set a good morning routine to get them to school on time and relaxed with everything they need. Our school bell goes at 8.55am, students settle in better if they are not late to school.
- Be positive about school and set good habits from day one.
