HOT DAY PROTOCOL



When we have very hot weather we operate a Hot Day Protocol at school. Usually our children go outside during the breaks to play with friends and enjoy the benefits of being active. We recognise that with the very hot weather this can pose some risks, especially around dehydration and heat related concerns. So on very hot days we will be having an indoor option for the children to use at break times, typically anything over 25 degrees in the forecast will trigger the Hot Day Protocol.

We are fortunate that all our inside areas (apart from the Matariki Hall) are air conditioned so it allows for optimum learning and teaching conditions.

SUN SAFETY

During the summer (Terms 1&4), all pupils are encouraged to put on sunscreen at home before school and <u>MUSI</u> wear a named regulation school hat while outside. *Our Sun Sense Policy is: No hat – play in the shade*

SWIMMING - TERM 1, 2025

Our Swimming Pool is all set for the season. Our swimming instructor from Kelly Sports is really looking forward to seeing the children and helping them with their swimming skills. Looking at the statistics of swimming rescues this year has certainly shown the value of having our swimming programme up and running for our Tamariki.



Due to the lack of funding we will only be swimming in Terms 1&4 this year. Years 3-6 will have 10 lessons and our Year 2 classes will have one session in the pool at the end of Term 1.

The Year 5&6 classes begin the year. Our Year 2 classes will have one fun session towards the end of Term 1. The Year 3&4 classes will be swimming in Term 4. The Year 3-6's swim in 4 groups and will have 10 lots of 25 minute lessons.

Your classroom teacher will let you know via Seesaw when it is your child's swimming block. Please make sure all their towels, togs, swimming bag and school uniform are clearly named so items can be returned to the owner quickly.

SCHOOL HOURS

Just a reminder that school starts at **8.55am sharp** and it is important for children to be here at that time. We appreciate your efforts however; if for any reason you do arrive late (after 8.55am) please report to the School Office where a "Late Card" will be issued to your child before heading to your learning area. School finishes at 3.00pm.

EARLY ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL BEFORE 8.15AM

Children are welcome to arrive at school from **8.15am onwards**. The school gates are closed until 8.15am each day. Teachers have planning to do before school in their classrooms and are unavailable to supervise any students arriving before 8.15am. We offer a Before School Care facility; Enrolment Forms are available from the School Office or via our School website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u>

LATE ARRIVALS (AFTER 8.55AM)

We ask parents to ensure their children arrive at school with at least five minutes to spare, for them to organise themselves by hanging up their school bag and sorting their book bag independently. We understand there may be rare occasions where your child arrives late at school (after 8.55am). We require families to report to the School Office for your child to be issued a Late Card prior to heading to their learning areas. We appreciate your effort in ensuring your child/ren arrive at school in good time before the first bell at 8.55am.

SAFETY IN AND AROUND OUR SCHOOL PLEASE COMPLY WITH THESE GUIDELINES

With the return of lots of excited children and new families to our school we need to reinforce some important Te Totara Guidelines and Rules to you all.

Please cross Hector Drive by <u>using the pedestrian crossing with the lights</u>. It is not safe nor modelling good practice to cross to the other side of the road in front of the school as there are multiple ways cars are moving in this area. The staff on duty at the end of the day will be directing the students to the pedestrian crossing. If you park on the other


side of the road please use the crossing to go across the street.

• Some good areas to park are on some of the surrounding streets slightly away from the school. We have easy access to many of these streets through some great walkways, one of which is opposite the front of the school. Children can be encouraged to cross the street at the pedestrian crossing, then go through that walkway and meet you at your vehicle on the street at the end of the walkway.









- The drop-off zone in front of the school is also a convenient area to pick up your children. <u>All drivers must remain in the vehicles</u>, the children are asked to come straight to the front of the school and look for their car. When they see their car the students are taught to go straight to the car if it is in the lane closest to the school buildings, or if the car is in the lane furthest away the students need to come down to **Mr Murray** at the marked traffic hump and she will cross them safely. To ensure everyone's safety with moving cars <u>no-one (adults or children) is to cross the drop-off zone in any other area than the part that Mr Murray is at.</u>
- The drop-off zone has two access lanes so you can turn into either the left or right lane depending on where you are going when you exit the drop off. If you are going to travel north up Hector Drive towards Rototuna Junior High then please use the left lane closest to the school. Always

indicate your intention then turn left onto Hector Drive as you exit the zone.

- Do not change lanes in the drop off zone. We ask that you remain in the lane you are in throughout the drop-off zone, it is dangerous to cross over the lanes.
- Mr Murray monitors the safety of this area, it is a very efficient process and we endeavour to keep it moving well. It is generally all cleared of cars by 3.15pm, so great for those prompt getaways!



SCHOOL UNIFORM

We are delighted with the large numbers of students who look really great by wearing their uniform in the correct manner. For your information the school uniform expectations are below:

<u>ALL</u> students are expected to arrive at school and leave from school in their correct Te Totara Primary School Uniform, including footwear.

- Uniforms are to be worn clean, neat and tidy. Please clearly name your uniform items.
- Students are encouraged to take pride in their school uniform and to wear it well.
- Hair is to be off the face, tied back if longer than the bottom of the collar, and be the natural hair colour.
- Nail polish and cosmetics are not permitted.
- Second hand uniforms may be available. Please see the School Office for details.
- Variations in relation to the Human Rights Act may be negotiated with the Principal.
- All pupils are encouraged to use sunscreen at home before school and expected to wear the regulation school hat while outdoors. No hat play in the shade (Terms 1 & 4).
- All uniform items should be clearly named.
- Extras for warmth such as polyprops or singlets, must be plain black.
- Plain black school sandals in summer (Terms 1&4) OR plain black school school shoes in the winter (Terms 2&3). No other colours on the sandal or shoe, just plain black.
- Any hair accessory is to be <u>plain</u> and of a single school uniform colour red, white, black, green



JEWELLERY

Items of jewellery can be easily lost or damaged at school. They may also cause injury to the wearer or other students. For safety reasons items of jewellery are NOT to be

worn. The school accepts no responsibility in the case of loss, damage or injury.

However, students may wear:

- a) One small earring stud per ear.
- b) A watch.
- c) A necklace of religious or cultural significance to be worn underneath clothing.
- d) A Medical Identification Tag as required.


ALLERGIES/MEDICAL CONDITIONS

In the event of a medical emergency, if your child has a medical condition, is taking regular medicine/tablets or has an allergy (including sticking plasters etc), please advise the School Office (*if you haven't already*), so we can amend your records accordingly.

We also have several children in school with allergies and we have procedures in place to keep these children safe, including not sharing food/drink, washing tables, and hand washing before and after eating. Thank you for your cooperation in these matters.

APPOINTMENTS AT SCHOOL

We love to see families at school and appreciate the home and school partnership. However, we are finding that we have a number of "cold callers" arriving and expecting to see either a leadership person or a teacher. This can pose problems as we often have commitments elsewhere and can't do justice to any queries that you may have. We certainly don't want to stop the great communication in place, but would appreciate either a phone call or email so that we can make an appointment to give you the time needed to sort out any queries. This phone call or email will need to be done a day or two prior to the appointment.






