Voluntary School Donation - what is it used for?

Voluntary School Donation - Full \$120.00
Year (eldest or only child) GST exempt

Voluntary School Donation Sibling \$60.00
- Full Year GST exempt

We want to provide our children with the full benefits of extensive resources, additional learning programmes and special opportunities that we can all be very proud of. This can only be achieved with your help and support.

School Donation funds are used to purchase additional sports gear, reading resources, library books, music, art equipment and helps subsidise our swimming programme.

The voluntary school donations are currently set at \$120.00 for the first or only child and \$60.00 for the second and subsequent children. There has been no increase in our school donation since 2016. School donations are voluntary, but we would be highly appreciative of any payments.

This donation is tax deductible and a $\frac{1}{3}$ can be claimed back from the IRD. The IR526 form is downloadable from the IRD website.

Other Fees

Mathletics or Mathseeds

Mathletics is a web-based programme that can be adapted to meet student's individual abilities. Mathletics provides instant feedback on each student's performance which helps to maintain a high level of student motivation.



We have been impressed with how engaged the students are and how quickly they start to improve their mathematical skills and mental arithmetic.

It can be beneficial in the earlier years for an adult to sit with their child while on the programme. Although this is a great way for parents to engage with their child's Maths learning, we realise that this is not always possible for busy families.

This programme has been so successful in previous years and we are excited to be able to provide you with a subscription to Mathletics for **\$20.00 per child** for a year (usually a one-year subscription costs \$99 per child). Subscribing to Mathletics will entitle students to 24-hour web access both at home and in school.

A User ID and Password will be distributed to your child by the classroom teacher shortly after they start at Te Totara Primary School.

Swimming Programme

On our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u> you will find Swimming Pool information. The fees are currently \$60.00 per student for 10x lessons.



The purpose of the swimming programme is to:

- Encourage students by making their learning to swim experience fun and rewarding.
- Provide a progressive curriculum which focuses on developing water confidence and then builds fundamental swimming skills to a level which confidence and competence is achieved.
- Motivate students through tangible rewards which illustrate their individual progress.
- Track all students' achievements through our Student Management System.

SIBLING OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2025 Enrolment Period of 28th June - 17th December, 2025

(children turning 5 years of age between these dates)

The Board is looking to accommodate, if possible, younger siblings and children of staff in the 2025 school year. To help determine this, we need to have OUTZ Enrolment Forms into the School Office to help with this process. Please complete an Enrolment Form for each child, which is available online from our school website by clicking on the following link: www.tetotara.school.nz or by visiting the School Office.

The Board will look at the number of enrolments, the level of projected student growth and determine how many spaces for out-of-zone students are available for the upcoming enrolment period of **28th June - 17th December, 2025**. This will be completed late April, allowing for lots of time for families to know what is happening. Further information around the number of out-of-zone spaces to be released will be communicated via the school newsletter over the next few weeks.

Please return the completed OUTZ Enrolment Form, including the relevant documentation, to the School Office by <u>Thursday 6th March</u>, <u>2025</u>.

Note: If your child is successful in gaining an OUTZ place, in order to comply with the MOE criteria, your child MUST start school before the end of the 2025 school year or they will forfeit their OUTZ place.

UNWELL CHILDREN WHO NEED TO GO HOME

Our Administration team and teaching staff act in the very best interests of your child and their well-being is paramount. When children arrive at the School Office, and depending on the

situation, most of the children are offered a rest in our Wellness Room and re-assessed before a phone call home; often they return to their classroom.

We understand many of our families have work commitments however, if you are phoned by the school to collect your child from school due to illness, it would be appreciated if you could arrange for their collection as soon as possible. For the privacy of other students, the School Office staff will collect your child from the Wellness Room when you arrive. Please wait in the School Office area.



If your child is sick, please keep them at home until they are well. If your child has diarrhoea or vomiting we ask that they do not return to school unless they are well and have had **no further diarrhoea or vomiting for 48 hours prior to returning – these bugs can be highly contagious.**Thank you for your support.

TE TOTARA CELLPHONE RULE

At Te Totara our approach towards cellphones is "away for the day", meaning the device should be turned off, and handed in to the teacher to be locked away during the school day.

We strongly recommend students \underline{do} not \underline{do} bring communication devices to school with them. If a student does bring their cellphone for

emergency contact, it <u>must</u> be handed to the teacher when they arrive at school to be locked away.

We understand that some parents like their children to have a phone to be in contact with them after school and these can be collected from the classroom teacher at the end of the day. If a parent or caregiver needs to contact their child urgently during the day, they should call the School Office on (07) 853-0039.

If students do make the decision to bring a cellphone onto the school grounds, they do so at their own risk. The school is not responsible for any loss or damage caused to any cellphone or communication device.

If we see or know of a student using a personal digital device (including smart watches) without permission during the school day, we will confiscate it. It will be placed in the office to be collected at the end of the day by a parent or guardian.



SCHOOL PARKING EXPECTATIONS

NO PARKING ON/OVER FOOTPATHS

Please.... No parking on or over the grass or footpaths at all. Several cars were seen parking over the footpaths at school recently, mainly on Hector Drive right in front of our school, blocking access for all pedestrians. This is a very serious health and safety risk so please show consideration for others when parking.





NO PARKING IN DISABLED PARKING SPACES

Just a reminder a mobility car park space is a specially designated car parking space for disabled people. You must have a mobility card to use a mobility park.

Please DO NOT park in these car parks unless you have a mobility card.

An online course covers essential topics such as:


- Building Connection & Effective Communication
